Mission Statement or Philosophy: SJCS is a private, Roman Catholic, co-educational, college preparatory day school recognized and approved by and within the Diocese of Charleston. SJCS seeks academic excellence and strives to form the minds, hearts, and souls of its students in the Likeness of Christ.

School History: A forty-year dream for a Catholic High School in the Upstate became a reality when, in 1993, the work and prayers of many individuals, united by the desire to improve the choices for secondary education in the area, culminated in the opening of St. Joseph's High School in Greenville. The school's beginnings, or what those close to the school often refer to as "The Miracle", began with a group of nine lay founders. Armed with a single donation of \$800, these founders set out on a massive mailing campaign to "get the word out" that after many years of planning and discussions, the school was finally going to open. On August 26, 1993, classes began at St. Joseph's High School for thirteen ninth grade students in a small house leased to the school for one dollar by St. Michael's Lutheran Church on Augusta Road. From its inception, SJCS has grown to its current size of 685 students and more than 50 full time teachers. For the last six years, St. Joseph's has been recognized by the National Catholic Honor Role as a School of Excellence, a designation given to less than 5% of schools nationwide.

Features of Curriculum / Instructional Program(s) used for eligible students: We have two programs for students with various levels of learning challenges. The Thomas Aquinas program is a one period pull-out program with a dedicated teacher and classroom. The focus is on study skills and content reinforcement. The Saint John Bosco program uses the SOAR curriculum for study and organizational skills.

Assessments: Our students with exceptional needs are not uniquely tested.

We do not use a preset curriculum. Each department selects it's curriculum with approval by the Academic Dean.

Assessments:

While St. Joseph's participates in multiple national assessment programs each year, we use the ITBS for grades 6-8, the OLSAT for high school freshmen, and PSAT for sophomores and juniors.

Assessment Results:

ITBS Composite Scores for 2014-15 (all students): 6th grade 86; 7th grade 84; 8th grade 84; OLSAT scores for 2014-15 National Percentile Rank of 87; School Ability Index 118; Grades 10 and 11 PSAT scores Critical Reading 54; Math 53; Writing 54
