Graduation Requirements: Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) is computed at the end of each semester. All high school classes are used when determining GPA Honors, AP, and College Credit courses are weighted.

Curriculum / Instructional Programs: The Diocese of Charleston Curriculum provides the framework for the instruction at St. Anne School. St. Anne uses the approved curriculum found on the website of the Diocese of Charleston.

Assessments: Students in grades 2-9 take the MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) a minimum of twice per year. Students in grades 2-6 took the IOWA test of Basic Skills. The CoGAT is administered to students in grades 1,2,4,6. PSAT is administered in grades 7-10.

Assessment Results:
