Mission Statement or Philosophy: A CCES education prepares students to think deeply, act responsibly, live vigorously, believe faithfully, lead resolutely, and create imaginatively

School History: Christ Church Episcopal School is a co-educational Episcopal day school that opened in downtown Greenville, SC in 1959 for 218 students in grades K4 – 6. Today, CCES serves 1,149 students in grades Primer – 12 on a 72-acre campus. Five major facilities and several smaller athletic buildings dot the Cavalier Campus. The oldest is the current Lower School building for grades Primer 4, built in 1971 as an Upper School and renovated in 2002 when all CCES students were consolidated on one campus. In 1972, the field house arts wing, and auditorium were added. In 1995, a new Middle School building (grades 5–8) opened, followed by a new Upper School facility in 2002, and a chapel in 2005. This summer, construction began on a Performing Arts Center to replace the school's auditorium. Throughout its history CCES has built an unassailable reputation for excellence. Since the school's first graduating class in 1972, 183 students have earned distinction as National Merit Finalists, and the 14-year-old IB Diploma program consistently posts pass rates that exceed national and world averages. Our athletic program has garnered 80 state championships since 1975 and today offers 47 varsity, junior varsity, and middle school teams. Servant leadership is nurtured through weekly chapels and the service learning program.
