School History: The school was founded in 1975 with a Kindergarten class. Grades were added until the secondary program was completed. We have over 600 alumni serving in every area of church place and marketplace ministry. Our founder, Dr. Garth Sibert, wanted the church to develop a fully integrated educational ministry to provide a uniquely Christian education to children in the TriCounty area. Academics are first priority, and our Stanford Achievement Test scores are typically in the 88th percentile rank. We offer a college preparatory and an honors diploma. Fine arts are our second major emphasis: music instruction 1st-12th grades, both choral and instrumental, many speech opportunities, drama club, debate team, and other activities. These are life skills as well as immediately useful ministry skills. Our third focus is athletics: intramural elementary sports, physical education, and Junior Varsity and Varsity sports. Our tuition structure seeks to make an excellent Christian education to all families, including those with more than one child.


