Mission Statement or Philosophy: Saint Joseph Catholic School integrates all learning with faith. Saint Joseph Catholic School endeavors to assist parents in nurturing the necessary intellectual, spiritual, social, emotional, physical, and moral skills to become productive, ethical citizens in the Catholic tradition by providing a sanctuary where academic excellence and spiritual growth can flourish.

School History: 1967 St. Joseph Catholic School opens, staffed by the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia. In 1987 St. Joseph Catholic Church & School breaks ground on the present church and an addition to the school. By 1988 the addition to the school is opened, and the new church is blessed by Rev. Fred Hopwood, Vicar. In 1991 the last of the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia teach at the school and 1992 was the first year of a total lay staff and administration at St. Joseph School. In 2003 the Diocese approves structural renovations to school's roof, exterior walls and HVAC system under the direction of Rev. James Dubrouillet. In 2010 St. Joseph Catholic School makes plans to add sixth grade for 2010-11. The school receives permission from the Bishop to add seventh grade in 2011-12, and eighth grade in 2012-13. St. Joseph School receives 2 portable classrooms to accommodate the growth in the middle school in 2012. One is used for Middle School Social Studies and Language Arts the other for Spanish and Music classes. Also in 2012, the Diocese of Charleston Catholic Schools Office receives accreditation from Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, thereby granting accreditation to St. Joseph Catholic School.
