Mission Statement or Philosophy: The mission of St. Peter's Catholic School is to meet the learning needs of all our students and to recognize the individual uniqueness God has instilled in each of them. We provide an interscholastic program where our primary academic goal is to educate the whole child. It is the aim of our school to provide an environment and educational program that encompasses the elements of moral, intellectual, physical, emotion and social development.

School History: In 1987, Father Martin Laughlin, now Monsignor, looked over his congregation at St. Peter's Church. He saw many young parents, and had a vision of them waiting for their children to be dismissed from school. He knew that they wanted to educate their children, and that the education should be at a Catholic school. In August of 1991, the parents of 79 children took a leap of faith and enrolled their children in K4 - 1st grade in an eight room education wing of the parish complex. The new school consisted of five classrooms, a library, a work room and an office. As grades were added, the existing space diminished until, in 1995, Father Laughlin was given permission by the bishop at that time, to construct a new building on the church property on Lady's Island. Through the support of the parishioners, and the vision of the pastor, St. Peter's Catholic School was built in its current location. The purpose of the new building would be two-fold - it would serve the students of the school as well as the students of the Parish School of Religion. To this day, the Catechetical Education Center continues this service to both ministries. Grades were continually added until St. Peter's became a pre-kindergarten through eighth grade school. The first eighth grade class consisted of four students and their graduation was held in the spring of 1998.

The lower grades provide a broad program of content-oriented learning activities. The upper grades include religion, language arts, math, science, and social studies. Art, music, PE and Spanish enhance the curriculum

Assessments: The Iowa Assessments are given at second through eighth grades and the COG/AT at the first and fourth grades. The PSAT is also given to the eighth grade.

Assessment Results:

St. Peter's Catholic School students' average score on the Iowa Assessments is in the upper third of the nation. This average reflects all students including those with special needs.
