School History: Bishop England High School was founded on September 22, 1915 on Queen St in downtown Charleston as part of the Cathedral school. The Reverend Joseph L. O'Brien organized the new school with the cooperation of the Reverend James J. May. At that time, there were 67 students enrolled in four grade levels: seventh, ninth, tenth, and eleventh. That first faculty consisted of three diocesan priests and three Sisters of Charity of Our Lady of Mercy (OLM).
