Mission Statement or Philosophy: At Divine Redeemer Catholic School in Hanahan, South Carolina, we believe that each child is a vital member of Christ's body. Serving students in grades K-3 through 8, our school exists to help each child fulfill his or her God-given potential. Divine Redeemer School guides students through the sacramental life of the Church, provides an excellent academic foundation, and prepares them to live out their faith as productive members of society.

School History: Divine Redeemer Catholic School was founded in 1960 by the "sisters, under the direction of the pastor/bishop." It opened with 84 students in grades 1 & 2, and added grades quickly, with our first class graduating in 1962. Today the school serves students in grades K-3 through 8, and has approximately 65 families in attendance. Though various religious orders have staffed the school at different times throughout its history, today there is a lay administrator and an all-lay faculty and staff. Divine Redeemer Catholic School is located in Hanahan, South Carolina, in Berkeley County. Hanahan is a suburban community which is adjacent to the cities of North Charleston and Goose Creek, and is considered to be part of the greater-Charleston area. Divine Redeemer Catholic School lies within the boundaries of the Berkeley County School District. While the great majority of our students are Catholic, there are also students of other faiths included in the student body. Divine Redeemer Catholic School has a very diverse student body comprised of Caucasian students, multi-racial students, Asian students, and Hispanic students. We also welcome, and have experience with, students who are studying from abroad.

Grading System: Divine Redeemer Catholic School follows the grading system of the Diocese of Charleston. (98-100 = A+, 95-97 = A, 92-94 = A-, 89-91 = B+, 86-88 = B, 83-85 = B-, 80-82 = C+, 77-79 = C, 74-76 = C-, 70-73 = D, Below 70 = F. (The lower grades use a mastery grading system, or descriptive grades, such as Excellent, Good, Satisfactory, Needs Improvement, Unsatisfactory.)

Graduation Requirements:

Students graduate from 8th grade if they have passing grades and acceptable attendance rates.

Curriculum / Instructional Programs:

The following subjects are taught at Divine Redeemer Catholic School: Religion, English Language Arts (includes Reading, Writing, Spelling, Vocabulary, Literature, Grammar, and Penmanship), Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Spanish, Computer/Technology, Physical Education, and Fine Arts.

Assessments:

Students in grades 1-8 take the Iowa Assessments and/or the CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test).

Assessment Results:

School averages: Reading - 53rd percentile, Language Arts - 54th percentile, Math - 46th percentile. Grade 8 averages: Reading - 66th percentile, Language Arts - 79th percentile, Math - 52nd percentile.
