**School History:** In 1986, St. John Neumann Parish acquired the WildeWood School in the Northeast Richland community of Columbia, South Carolina. The goal of the parish was to provide a quality Catholic education for the growing community. St. John Neumann School has had the distinction of having quality teachers, an academically advanced program, and a low student turn overrate. Carefully planned expansion and renovation projects resulted in enrollment growth from 110 students in 1989, includes Preschool to sixth grade, and numbers are 305 students. In its short history, St. John Neumann has received the National Blue Ribbon Award twice for having test scores in the top 90% of the nation. The standard of an invitational education is the process by which students, faculty, staff, and parents are cordially, creatively, and consistently made to feel ownership in their school. St. John Neumann School continues to support the concept that teachers, parents and students play an integral role in the continuous development of a quality education.
