Below you will find descriptions of the programs, services, and resources that Charleston Collegiate School offers exceptional needs students with documented disabilities:

#### Academic Achievement Program

The goal of the Academic Achievement Program (AAP) is to create an educational atmosphere that is beneficial to a child's success. When providing academic assistance, Charleston Collegiate recognizes that each student is a unique learner and seeks to find academic strategies that fit the student's learning style. The objective of the program is to give each student the skills they need to succeed academically and become an independent learner. Building a strong academic foundation is the focus of this Lower School program.

#### Student Support Services

The goal of Student Support Services is to create an educational atmosphere that is beneficial to a child's success. When providing academic assistance, Charleston Collegiate recognizes that each student is a unique learner and seeks to find academic strategies that fit their learning style.

Teachers, parents, or students may utilize Student Support Services by first requesting a student observation from the Student Support Specialist. The Student Support Specialist will complete a Student Observation Form, talk with the student's teachers, and review academic data about the student. Once all the necessary information is gathered, the Student Support Specialist will meet with the student, parents, and other necessary team members to discuss appropriate strategies to meet the student's learning needs. The Student Support Specialist may then work with the family to determine if there is a need for a psychoeducational evaluation. Students in grades 5-12 must have a full scale psychoeducational evaluation, 504 plan, or IEP on file in order to receive academic accommodations, which may include a Student Support Class.

Charleston Collegiate School acknowledges and accommodates diverse learning needs and welcomes students who can benefit from the curriculum without significant modifications. Charleston Collegiate School uses a team approach to help students identify learning strategies that will help them navigate our curriculum.

#### Accommodation Plans

In order to serve our students with documented learning disabilities, Charleston Collegiate provides reasonable accommodations. If accommodations are requested, parents are required to provide a copy of any psychoeducational, neuropsychological, speech/language, or other evaluation to the Student Support Specialist. All evaluations must be kept current (no more than four years old). The Learning Specialist will summarize and share the results of the academic testing with teachers and administrators and develop an Academic Accommodation Plan that reflects the needs of the student.

The report must be according to each participating private school, and for participating students, in which there are at least thirty participating students who have scores for tests administered. If the Education Oversight Committee determines that the thirty participating-student cell size may be reduced without disclosing personally identifiable information of a participating student, the Education Oversight Committee may reduce the participating-student cell size, but the cell size may not be reduced to less than ten participating students.

#### INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by Charleston Collegiate School (the "School"), solely to assist the School with certain requirements of the SC Education Oversight Committee in its determination of the School's eligibility to participate in the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program for the year ended June 30, 2018. Charleston Collegiate School's management is responsible for the School's records. This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the School and the SC Education Oversight Committee as specified in this report. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Our procedures and findings are as follows:

1. **Procedure:** We verified that the grants received by the School under the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program through Exceptional SC were for eligible students enrolled in the School by verifying attendance of the students who received the grant for the year ended June 30, 2018 to the School's attendance records.

Finding: No findings were identified.

2. **Procedure:** We reviewed deposit details from Exceptional SC associated with the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program to determine that the total amount of funding received was allocated as awarded per student.

Finding: No findings were identified.

3. **Procedure:** We reviewed the allocation of grants to each student's account for the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program to determine that no grant allocation and/or disbursement exceeded \$11,000 per student for the School year ended June 30, 2018.

Finding: No findings were identified.

4. **Procedure:** We reviewed the School's documentation (as applicable) that it returned a prorated amount of the grant received from Exceptional SC under the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program when any recipient withdrew during the School's year ended June 30, 2018.

Finding: No findings were identified.

5. **Procedure:** We verified that the total amount of the Exceptional SC grant funding under the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program for the School year ended June 30, 2018, was used for tuition, which is defined as the "total amount of money charged for the cost of a qualified student to attend

an independent school including, but not limited to, fees for attending school and school-related transportation" by inspecting the granted student's tuition records.

Finding: No findings were identified
