Dear Colleague:

This year we had 10 students in our multi-aged upper school program known as Brennan Hall. The breakdown by grades was as follows: 5 students in 4th grade, 2 students in 5th grade, 1 in 6th grade and 1 in 7th grade (he joined in January). We also had 1 in 10th grade. We used the Stanford 10 Achievement Test in grades 4 through 10, and the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) as a practice test for our 10th grader. Due to the layout of the test the following reading and math summaries do not include the language or spelling sections and only 4th grade has a word study skills section so that is also omitted.
